


ILLINOIS' INDUSTRIAL/COMMERCIAL ELECTRICITY PRICES (Cents per Kilowatt hour)

THE FUTURE OF EV IS IN ILLINOIS

Home to more than 800 auto industry companies and nearly 40 cell and automotive battery manufacturers

\$70M in capital funds for EV infrastructure projects to advance the state's position as top EV ecosystem

Reimagining Electric Vehicles in Illinois (REV) Act which passed in October, 2021 incentivizes EV businesses to move or expand in Illinois, including:

- Payroll tax withholdings credits attributable to new employees of up to 100% of withholdings
- Corporate income tax credit up of to 25% of eligible training costs for new employees
- Exemptions on building materials occupation tax, utility taxes for electrical and natural gas usage, and the telecommunications excise tax
- Corporate income tax credits for construction workers employed during the construction of a facility of up to 75% of the tax imposed on construction wages

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

REIMAGINING ELECTRIC VEHICLES (REV)

The REV Program provides manufacturers of electric vehicles (EV), EV component parts, and EV power supply equipment manufacturers with incentives for qualifying Illinois manufacturers

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION AND NO INVENTORY TAX

Illinois does not collect a state tax on personal property. All property other than real estate is exempt from the property tax in Illinois. Thus, all classes of personal property - including machinery, equipment, inventories, and intangibles - are exempt.

EDGE TAX CREDIT

EDGE provides tax credits to qualifying companies, equal to 50% of the amount of state income taxes withheld from the salaries of employees in the newly created full-time jobs. Additionally, 10% of eligible training costs can also receive an annual tax credit. Credits are non-refundable and can be used against corporate income taxes to be paid over a period not to exceed 10 years.

ENTERPRISE ZONE (EZ)

An EZ is a specific area designated by a municipality and certified by the State of Illinois. Businesses located within an enterprise zone are eligible for a sales tax exemption on building materials and machinery/equipment consumables.

HIGH IMPACT BUSINESS (HIB) BENEFITS

The HIB program provides incentives similar to those offered within an enterprise zone to companies that make a minimum of \$12 million investment causing the creation of 500 full-time jobs.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY INCENTIVES

Several of Illinois' utilities offer an extensive portfolio of energy efficiency programs that offer a variety of incentives to help businesses manage energy use and save money on electricity bills.

INFRASTRUCTURE GRANTS

The Illinois Department of Transportation may be able to provide funds to support various infrastructure projects, such as public roadway improvements, rail spurs, and truck access.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

PRIME SITES CAPITAL PROGRAM

Assists companies with large-scale capital investment projects that commit to significant job creation for Illinois residents as they relocate or expand operations within Illinois. Prime Sites grants can encompass a wide range of economic development projects that will result in job creation in the state of Illinois.

MANUFACTURING, MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT EXEMPTION

Manufacturing Machinery & Equipment Exemption allows for an exemption from State sales taxes for qualifying machinery and equipment purchases. Qualifying purchases may include, supplies and consumables including fuels, coolants, solvents, oils, lubricants, and adhesives, hand tools, protective apparel, and fire and safety equipment, primarily used or consumed in a manufacturing process.

EXPORT ASSISTANCE

Illinois' State Trade and Export Promotion (ISTEP) provides Illinois' small businesses with both financial and technical assistance to increase exports. ISTEP includes 5 options for Illinois' companies to grow export sales: Group Trade Missions, Individual Foreign Market Sales Missions, and Product Compliance, International Marketing Support, and Export Education Program.

ADDITIONAL LOCAL INCENTIVES

Many local communities offer additional incentives, such as grants and tax increment financing.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The Illinois Department of Commerce's Office of Employment and Training (OET) can provide assistance through federally funded workforce development programs for eligible participants.

ON-THE-JOB TRAINING

- Designed to help employers hire, train, and retain employees
- Provides up to a 75% wage reimbursement during the new employee's training period

CUSTOMIZED TRAINING

- Designed to help employers hire, train, and retain employees
- Provides up to a 75% wage reimbursement during the new employee's training period

REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS

- Designed to help employers hire, train, and retain employees and enable those employees to earn an industry recognized portable credential
- Combines on-the-job training and related instruction, enabling participants to earn money while they learn a particular set of skills
- National criteria allow participants to earn nationally recognized certificates of completion certifying occupational proficiency

INCUMBENT WORKER TRAINING

- Designed to help employers upgrade the skills of current employees
- Provides up to a 90% reimbursement of training costs

MANUFACTURING TRAINING ACADEMIES

Facilities focused on expanding training for high-demand manufacturing jobs of the future.





ILLINOIS: A STATE OF SERVICE

Through a network of trade specialist located in Chicago and six well established regional foreign offices in **Belgium**, **Canada**, **China**, **Israel**, **Japan and Mexico**, The Illinois Department of Commerce's Office of Trade and Investment (OTI) provides export assistance to Illinois businesses interested in growing their global footprint, connecting companies to foreign governments, chambers of commerce and other strategic partners around the world, while also promoting Illinois on a global stage, bringing new businesses, jobs and investment to Illinois.

In collaboration with Intersect Illinois, the State's public-private partner for business attraction, the Illinois Department of Commerce offers the following services:

- Regional collaboration and intergovernmental coordination
- Project-specific data analyses
- Workforce, labor, and wage analyses

- Trade assistance
- Investment packages & state incentives
